Meeting Started at 1000 Hrs.

Motion to approved May 14, 2019 meeting minutes made by Chief Painter, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chief Disbrow, No discussion, Motion approved by all.

### Old Business:

Chief Haas asked about trailer lettering. Wally stated he received additional quotes just prior to AHAC meeting. The Swift Water trailer lettering will be brought to the Executive Board on June 26 for final approval.

The Structural Collapse trailer quote has lettering and outside compartment doors to be fixed. Chief Disbrow stated he could fix the doors for \$300.00 with no labor. Wally will discuss with him about when and where to take the trailer.

Brian Guccion asked about getting a quote from Fast Signs in Sharon. Wally will meet with them about getting a quote.

The new All Weather rain gear sizing is complete. Team members wore it during a Rope training for fit and put on the rope harness to see if it is comfortable. All Team members present were happy with the gear.

The Swift Water PFD's are now inside the trailer.

The Region 5 flatbed housed in Sharon Fire is O.O.S.. The driveline broke after it left Sharon Fire to pick up some lumber. It had been towed for repairs.

Chief Haas stated the Sharon Showcase on June 1<sup>st</sup> worked out great. Derrel Larsen from the Rope Team set up a tripod with rope and showed the public on how rope works.

### New Business:

Chief Haas discussed about buying 2 PFD's for newer Swift Water Team members for a cost of \$459.90. A motion was made by Christina Fozio to purchase the PFD's, a 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chief Lindner, the only discussion was if we needed them. We had ordered PFD's in the past and received 7 additional PFD's and decided to purchase them then. Wally will look into whether we need them or not. Motion approved by all.

Chief Haas discussed about purchasing a Side Scan Sonar for the Swift Water Team. This is a budgeted item for 2019 for \$4500.00. The cost of this Sonar with training will cost \$4924.00. Training money for the Budget will be moved into equipment budget to purchase. The motion was made by Chief Painter, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chief Lindner. No discussion, Motion was approved by all.

Chief Haas asked Wally about the purchase of the T-600 radios. Wally stated he ordered them prior to the meeting but could only order 4 pair due to the cost increasing. Christina Fozio approved to purchase the additional pair of radios. The additional pair of radios will cost an extra \$35.06.

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Ben Nau asked the qt the next AHAC meeting if Chuck Kali could talk about Drones. Ben will advised Chuck to be present at the next meeting.

Chief Haas asked about discussing Cost Allocations at the next AHAC meeting. The Cost Allocation will end in 2020.

Brian Guccion asked Wally about batteries in the Structural Collapse trailer for the battery operated tools. These batteries are over 5 years old and might need replaced. Wally will gather all of these batteries and take them to Crandall Co. in Granger for testing and/or replacement.

The next meeting is July 10, 2019 at 1300 Hrs. in the EOC

Meeting adjournment motion was made by Chief Disbrow, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chief Lindner. No discussion, Motion to adjourn was approved by all
