Ben Nau

- The Hazard classifications have changed for the Tier II reports due in 2018. There are now many more hazard types listed. We will be sending the attached letter to all filers notifying them of the change. This also requires that all filers submit a new report this year, "no change" reports will not be allowed.
- The 2017 compliance report was sent to SERC, some of the information on the report is as follows.
 - o 33 EHS, 51 Non-EHS reported in 2017
 - o 14 RQ spills reported
 - o 14 Spill follow-up reports
 - o 11 Non-Compliance Letters Sent
 - o 6 compliance related telephone calls

Christina Fozio

- The draft budget was submitted to the EMA executive board and should be approved at the November meeting. The restructuring of the All Hazards team was completed this year and the All Hazards Advisory Committee has been working well. Due to this the Hazmat budget is included in the All Hazards Team budget for 2018.
- EMA is working on finalizing the pipeline plan.

Greg Smith

- There was recently a fire at St. Thomas Hospital in Akron. Smoke spread throughout much of the building. They
 evacuated 100 mental health and orthopedic patients. There were some challenges moving patients. Overall it
 went well, there were some good lessons learned.
- We had an Incident Management Team training at the hospital. Ben spoke about the state emergency response plan.
- The hospital has talked about the Las Vegas incident and what lessons were learned. We have also talked about how Medina Hospital would support that type of incident in Cleveland or Akron.
- The construction of the new decontamination room in the Medina Hospital Emergency Department is complete. Greg is working on a procedure. The room was already used yesterday morning for a corrections officer contaminated with Fentanyl.

Fred Romeo

- The Nexus pipeline was approved and will be going through Medina County. ODNR has no jurisdictional authority over the pipeline.
- There has been a couple of incidents recently of drilling rigs hitting gas pockets in other counties. One of them resulted in a fire.

Brad Karns

Regarding response to white powder letters, when an incident occurs the letter is sent by the FBI to the
Laboratory Response Network in Reynoldsburg. They require that a field screening protocol is followed by the
local hazmat team prior to accepting the letter at their facility. Brad offered to provide the training to the
Hazmat Team.
