- Greg gave the attached Hazmat Report
 - o Notable items:
 - We responded to the building collapse in Medina.
 - We responded to an incident in Wadsworth
 - The team recently received all new self-contained breathing apparatus, they were purchased on the Homeland Security grant.

- The reverification form to remain a type II Hazmat team was submitted
- The team needs interpreters they could call. There have been some recent difficulties speaking to truck drivers.

Christina Fozio

• Our goal for a few years has been for the all hazards team to have its own location to operate out of. We tried for a grant 2 years ago and did not get it. This year we resubmitted the grant, we worked with the Senate's budget and finance department to clarify the nexus to the state, which is required by the grant. As of yesterday, via phone call from Senator Obhof we are the recipients of \$400,000 for a safety services center. This building will store all the All hazards & EMA equipment. The building will include training rooms and will be used as a redundant site for bob & Michelle from OEMA. We worked with Sima (OEMA) on these details. We are currently looking at the county property behind the transit garage.
