- The incident from July 31st is being used as exercise credit for the 2019-2020 exercise year. Four objectives were evaluated, and it will count as a functional exercise. The exercise report will be available at the next LEPC meeting and will be approved at the October 9th SERC meeting.
- We will be submitting a no change review to the hazmat plan this year. It was extensively revised last year. SERC allows up to 3 no change reviews to be submitted. A copy of the hazmat plan was passed around.

Greg Smith – Hazmat Report

• The I-71 & I-76 incident on July 31st was a full team callout. When I contacted the on-scene incident commander to determine our needs and assist them in making decisions they were considering evacuations. After researching the chemical, we determined that was not necessary. An entry and backup team determined

multiple 300-gallon totes spilled and estimated 1500 gallons were on the ground. Due to the topography it was contained to that area. Ben and Claudia responded in 358-2 and assisted on scene. It was great working with multiple agencies.

Once Around

Greg Smith

- The next NECO exercise will include a hazmat component to get more participation from the EMA's.
- We had a large commercial fire in Valley City, it was a \$25,000,000 loss including the equipment inside. It was great to see prosecutor Thompson show up on scene and work with first responders.

• There is an issue with petroleum being released into Chippewa lake. The prosecutor's office is working with the sanitary engineer to determine the source. Dennis will bring the LEPC into the loop.

- 4 cost recovery's have been sent out since Feb.
